

How to join the EUCERT education programme and certification scheme – a quick guide for interested parties

One of the goals of the EUCERT programme is to establish a standard education for heat pump installers throughout all participating countries. To achieve this, certain minimum requirements have to be met by heat pump associations, the National Coordinators who will manage the training and training centres.

1. Organisational requirements

The EUCERT programme is coordinated by the European Heat Pump Association (EHPA) Education Committee. Information on the current members of the committee can be found on the EHPA website (www.ehpa.org/eucert).

In order for a new country to join the programme:

- A **national heat pump association** must exist. If this is not the case, it must be created and become a member of the EHPA before applying to join the EUCERT programme.
- The national heat pump association nominates a **National Coordinator** to maintain contact with the Education Committee. That may be the national heat pump association itself or another body that can take on the role of National Coordinator¹. Such nomination must be documented in writing to the Education Committee.
- The National Coordinator appoints a representative who will participate in meetings of the Education Committee. Delegation is possible! The appointment of a representative (and changes thereof) require written notification to the Chair of the Education Committee.
- The National Coordinator will oversee the execution of training in the applicant country. They will assign training institutes and maintain quality assurance of the training centre, the trainers and the training.

2. Application

The national heat pump association that meets the requirements listed above can apply for their country to join the EUCERT programme by completing the information on the attached form.

3. Acceptance / rejection of application

Applications will be considered and voted on by the members of the Education Committee. Further evidence of the suitability of the applicant and their proposed National Coordinator may be requested.

¹ It is not required that a nominated National Coordinator should be a member of the EHPA at the time of application but they should become a member of EHPA once the application is accepted.

Discussions in committee concerning an application are confidential and voting is anonymous. Where appropriate the Chair may provide feedback to rejected applications so that problem issues can be addressed and a new application submitted. The decision of the committee is final.

Once the application has been accepted, the applicant will be invoiced for the non-refundable one-time joining fee and the National Coordinator will be asked to sign an agreement to abide by the rules of the Education Committee and the EUCERT programme. The national coordinator must present detailed information on the training centres and must ensure their compliance with EUCERT requirements.

4. Fees

- The one-time fee to join the EUCERT programme in 2010 has been set to 750 Euro (plus VAT if applicable). EHPA will invoice the applicant for this amount.
- The training levy for 2010 payable to EHPA has been set to 5€ per trainee. EHPA will invoice the National Coordinator for this amount.

5. Know-how transfer and exchange of documents

Once the application has been accepted by the committee and the fee paid, the National Coordinator can:

- Participate as a voting member in meetings of the Education Committee
- Receive a password for the secure area of EHPA website
- Receive know-how and training materials (in English)

To receive know-how the applicant should choose an existing member of the committee to act as mentor during development of the training. This member will provide a “train the trainer” session and explain the material and the examination procedures. The applicant should pay the mentor directly for reasonable time and travel expenses as may be agreed.

Translated material in languages other than English may be available from another member of the programme. In this situation it is up to the National Coordinator and that member to reach a mutual agreement on the use of the translated material, with or without payment. Otherwise it is up to the National Coordinator (or national heat pump association) to arrange a new translation at their own cost.

5. Change of National Coordinator

In the event of resignation or dismissal of the National Coordinator the national heat pump association will be asked to propose a replacement. Membership of the EUCERT programme by that country will be suspended until a new National Coordinator is accepted by the committee and the relevant contracts signed.

If a new National Coordinator is not appointed within 6 months of the date of resignation or dismissal then membership of the EUCERT programme by that country will be terminated.

5. Termination of agreement

The procedures for termination of membership of the EUCERT programme are detailed in the rules of the Education Committee and in the contract with the National Coordinator.

Grounds for suspension or termination of membership could include gross misconduct, bringing the EUCERT programme into disrepute, failure to pay the training levy, failure to provide training statistics or failure to participate in the Education Committee meetings for more than one year without reasonable explanation.
